REFUGEES AND MIGRANTS

Ahead of the UN Summit last week, Cardinal Vincent Nichols joined calls for the international community to urgently address the migration crisis. Over 280,000 migrants have crossed the Mediterranean so far this year - tragically more than 3,000 have died trying. The Cardinal called for international co-operation to help create the conditions so people don't feel compelled to migrate in the first place – and to prioritise family unity by ensuring they are not forced to become economic migrants.

"This is a crisis that demands an urgent response from the international community", the Cardinal said. "We need to look at what drives people from their homes. The international community needs to co-ordinate registration and welcome. The victims of this lack of co-ordination are the very people who have been forced to leave home and are in desperate circumstances. I believe that people in this country are instinctively generous and through the community sponsorship scheme, led by Churches and faith groups, pathways to ensure this generosity is channelled in the most helpful way are being established. And so refugees and migrants can be welcomed into our communities."
